Letter from the Pastor

You who fear the Lord, trust in the Lord!

He is their help and their shield (Psalm 115:11)

There is a famous story about gifted Italian violinist Niccolo Paganini. One day, he was performing a difficult piece of music in front of many audiences. While his playing astonished the audience, all of a sudden, one of his four strings snapped. Everybody in the hall was frozen with shock and stared at him with worries about how he would handle this unexpected crisis. He frowned briefly, but he continued playing with three strings. A little later, the second string snapped, and shortly afterward, another string

broke. The crowd started to murmur because just a single string remained sticking on his violin, which is impossible to finish his performance with it. However, he was unfazed by these unfortunate incidents. Instead of giving up playing music, he kept playing with the remaining string. After he successfully completed his performance with only one string, a full house rose and gave him a round of applause because his performance with one remaining string surprised and fascinated the audience.

In our lives, we have many strings- a string of health, a string of wealth, a string of fame, or a string of knowledge and wisdom. Someone might have more strings while others have fewer. Or someone might have more powerful strings, while others

have weaker ones. Even though everyone has different kinds of strings in each one's life, the fact is that someday our strings would snap and hang limply from our lives. All strings that we hold are not going to last forever. Those strings that we rely on so much and trust more than God are not worthy to do so.

Psalm writer says that all you who fear the Lord, trust the Lord! He is your helper and your shield. It teaches us we should not lose "the string of faith" that connects us to God. Unless we cut or lose, God will keep our string of faith which never breaks, never tangles, never slackens, and never becomes eroded. By trusting the Lord, the string of faith will be our help when we are in trouble and will be our shield when facing danger because God is mighty and powerful to handle all situations. I hope we hold the string of faith tight, rather than let go of it.
