Letter from the Pastor

Spring flowers bloom among the Christmas decorations still placed on my front doorstep because of the laziness dressed up in the cunning guise of the excuse of cold weather. It is March. Regardless of the temperature outside, it is spring. As we know from experience, spring is when the life that shrinks during the cold winter stretches out. It is not that things that were not there at all appear. However, it may be different from what was there last year. No, it is different from the previous year. That is why spring is good. At the same time, March is also a time for Christians to have a precious new experience. It is a good opportunity to see the actual value of Jesus Christ and to reexamine ourselves as Christians. That opportunity is Lent. Lent is a period set by the church to visualize the

culminating moments when Jesus finished his mission on this earth. Naturally, it is a period when the essence of Jesus' ministry is almost entirely contained. So many churches encourage Christians to awaken and compare their lives to the life of Jesus during this period. This year, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. Many churches gather together on this day to make a resolution for the period ahead, and our church will also be trying to have that moment. It may be a little difficult, but I hope that you will also attend this moment and make this a place where our church and its members can make a resolution to spend precious and blessed Lenten moments together this year. In addition, one way to make this Lenten period a more intense opportunity to experience the life of Jesus Christ is to read the entire Four Gospels every day during

the 40 days of Lent. As you know, the Gospels contain the contents of Jesus' ministry on earth and the words of Jesus. Therefore, if you can read the entire Gospels during Lent, it will be a more meaningful time than ever. If someone wants to have a better moment than reading them all, writing the Gospels with your hands would be a good experience. One of my memorable experiences during the Lenten periods was that all church members took charge of each part of the Bible, transcribed it with their hands, and bound it into a complete Bible. Reading the Bible with your eyes is a good experience, but writing it with your hands will also be a different experience. During this Lenten season of 2025, whether you read the entire Four Gospels or transcribe it yourself, I hope it will be a moment of experiencing and communicating with Jesus Christ more seriously and sincerely than before and that you and the church will reaffirm the true Christian life.


