Letter from the Pastor

"Enough of this, God! Take my life—I'm ready to join my ancestors in the grave (1 Kings 19:5)!"

This is what an exhausted and burn-out prophet said to God. After his great triumph atop Mount Carmel against false prophets, a wicked queen Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah with a death threat. Prophet Elijah, worn out emotionally, physically, mentally, and spiritually, ran away and hid from the sight of people. We wonder what happened to his faith. He is one of the greatest prophets that we know. Now he is complaining to God and all of a sudden he wanted to disappear from this world.


